Shalom House of Prayer celebrates its 40th Anniversary

Saturday 11th April will be a day of celebrations at Shalom House of Prayer in Carcoar, marking the significant milestone of the 40th Anniversary since its foundation.

Since opening in 1975, Shalom has operated continuously as a non-profit establishment run by a lay community under the authority of the Catholic Bishop of Bathurst and welcomes all who wish to renew or deepen their relationship with God.

Current member of the community, Nick Hansen said, “Thousands of people have taken the opportunity to attend retreats, courses or participate in individual spiritual companionship since Shalom’s inception and we very much look forward to celebrating the 40 years of the House.”

To coincide with Shalom’s 40th Anniversary, Helen Bowers, one of the founding members of the community, has written an historical account of Shalom. “Let The Bells Ring Out – The Story of Shalom House of Prayer” tells of the difficulties, the personal challenges and the rewards experienced by the community, determined to stay faithful to the original vision. The book is an inspiring work, meticulously researched and told with Helen’s own brand of humour and is an important historical record.

Bishop Michael McKenna will launch “Let The Bells Ring Out” at the celebrations on Saturday, commencing with an Ecumenical Service at 12noon at the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, Carcoar.
