

π DAY

Tuesday was 14 March. March is the 3rd Month. In Australia we write this as 14/3 however in other countries around the world it is written as 3.14.

3.14 is a very important number in mathematics, as it is an approximation of pi. The knowledge of Pi being close to three dates back to the Bible (950BC) in 1 Kings 7:23.

In approximately 250BC, the mathematician Archimedes used polygons with many sides to approximate circles and determined that Pi was approximately 22 divided by 7.

Pi (π) is the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter. Pi is a constant number, meaning that for all circles of any size, Pi will be the same. To celebrate π Day, pi bracelets were made with the students that participated in the Year 6 into 7 Day at MacKillop.
