Letter from Bishop Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

Slowing the spread of Covid19 has required an unprecedented response from our public health authorities. We need to trust their expert judgment and cooperate together with their advice and directives. As Christians, we pray especially for the elderly and vulnerable and for healthcare workers and all who are on the front line in this emergency. I am just back from Vietnam, so have gone into self isolation at Matthew Quinn House for two weeks. Although I arrived home before the legal requirement came into effect. I have thought it prudent to observe the spirit of the public health directive.

As you know, our usual life has already been disrupted, including the routines of worshipping God together. I want to update you on the latest precautions we have had to take:

The latest directive from the public health authorities is that indoor gatherings of more than 100 persons are prohibited. This means that attendance at each Sunday Mass must be limited to that number, unless the Mass is celebrated outdoors.

In small communities this will not be a problem, but each larger parish is making its own plans to deal with the situation there. People should check with their parish website or office to find out how they will be

At this time, it would be advisable for elderly parishioners to celebrate Mass on weekdays, rather than on Sunday.

- 2. Special announcements regarding the celebration of Holy Week and Easter will be made according to the developing situation.
- 3. Attendance at funerals will need to be limited to close family and
- The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will continue to be administered individually to those who need it, but Anointing Masses are suspended until further notice. 4.

Check with your parish priest about arrangements for the other Sacraments during this time.

May I close with a prayer of St Patrick, the patron of our Diocese:

Lord, I praise and proclaim your name in all places, not only when things go well but also in times of stress. Whether I receive good or ill, I return thanks equally to God, who taught me always to trust him unreservedly.

Temporary Changes to Liturgical Celebrations in Light of COVID-19

Following advice from Bishop Michael McKenna and the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, it has been decided to immediately implement the following temporary changes in all Churches in the Parishes as a response to the current threat of coronavirus (COVID-19):

- <u>Holy Water</u> will be temporarily removed from stoups at the doors of the churches to reduce the possibility of transmission of the virus.
- Alcohol-based hand-sanitiser will be available for use at various places in the churches.
- When exchanging the <u>Sign of Peace</u>, individuals should avoid shaking hands but say "Peace be with you" and offer a smile, wave, nod or bow.
- All Ministers of Holy Communion should take particular care to wash their hands before and after distributing.
- The distribution of <u>Holy Communion from the Chalice</u> will be ceased until further notice. Please be reminded that Christ is fully present under either species.
- The coronavirus is easily spread through saliva. In celebrations of the Ordinary Form of the Latin Rite, the <u>Body of Christ will only be</u>

administered in the hand because of the high risk of transmission if people continue to receive on their tongue. Ministers should seek to avoid contact with the communicant's hands.

• Individuals should consider their own health, including any potential to infect others with a contagious disease, being attending a public liturgical celebration.

 The faithful who are too unwell to attend Sunday Mass - whether due to coronavirus or some other condition - or are at particular risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus should spend time in prayer.

Parishioners may be reassured that, should they contract COVID-19 and become seriously ill, our pastoral team will continue to ensure they receive the sacraments and other appropriate pastoral care.

These recommendations are believed to be proportionate to the current understanding of the coronavirus and the risks outlined by health authorities. They are consistent with the Catholic Church's prerogative to protect those who are most vulnerable and are subject to change without notice.
